

**MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE SCHOOL BOARD  
INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT 271  
Bloomington, Minnesota**

**April 29, 2019**

- I. ROLL CALL Pursuant to due call and notice thereof, and there being a quorum present, the School Board of Independent School District 271, was called to order by Chair Maureen Bartolotta at 7:00 p.m. on April 29, 2019, in the Arlene Bush Board Room at the Educational Services Center, 1350 West 106<sup>th</sup> Street, Bloomington, Minnesota.

AIPAC  
Recommendations  
Response

Tom Bennett moved, Nelly Korman seconded, that the School Board of Independent School District 271:

1. Directs the Superintendent, working in collaboration with the American Indian Parent Advisory Committee (AIPAC), to create a plan to ensure Minnesota Academic Standards relating to Minnesota American Indian Tribes are being taught at the appropriate grade levels. This plan must be shared with the School Board in September 2019.
2. Directs the Superintendent, working in collaboration with the American Indian Parent Advisory Committee (AIPAC), to create a plan to ensure culturally relevant training specific to Dakota and Ojibwe tribal communities of Minnesota is provided to District staff. The plan must be completed for implementation during the 2019-2020 school year.
3. Directs the Superintendent to study and make American Indian Program staffing recommendations to the School Board by July 1, 2019.

Motion carried unanimously.

Nerdery Agreement

Dawn Steigauf moved, Dick Bergstrom seconded, that the School Board of Independent School District 271 approves the agreement with The Nerdery LLC for the blueprinting and roadmap for a Special Education Information System (SEIS). Motion carried unanimously.

Federal, state, and district special education procedural requirements are competing for the time our special education staff have to work directly with students. District administration believes that there are opportunities to streamline district procedural requirements that will not undermine the integrity of state and federal requirements. Jennifer McIntyre is leading this streamlining to create greater efficiencies to free up more time for staff to work directly with students. Complementing this streamlining of district procedural requirements will be a process to consolidate our multiple data systems for Special Education - IEP, evaluation, scheduling, progress monitoring, 3rd party billing and program evaluation. District administration believes that there are opportunities to integrate our data systems to create a Special Education Information System (SEIS). The goal of the SEIS is to achieve greater efficiencies to free up more time for staff to work directly with students. John Weisser is leading the data systems streamlining and is recommending The Nerdery, LLC to be our partner in this work. The Nerdery will use a five week "Rapid Validation" approach to provide the District with a solution recommendation, roadmap and estimate for creation of a SEIS. The cost is \$125,800.

This action as recommended is a final action. Any subsequent action to return probationary teachers between now and the effective date of non-renewal based on course needs, retirements or resignations will be brought to the Board as rescission of this action for individually named teachers.

Healthy Savings  
Program

Beth Beebe moved, Dawn Steigauf seconded, that the School Board of Independent School District 271 approves using wellness funds for a trial of the Healthy Savings Program. Motion carried unanimously.

PreferredOne provides the District with funds each plan year for Wellness activities. After reviewing the Healthy Savings program, which offers members discounts on healthy food at the point of sale, the Insurance Committee is recommending using these wellness funds for a two-year trial of the program. At the end of the two years, a recommendation will come forward from the insurance committee to continue or not, based on utilization and actual savings. All employees enrolled in PreferredOne will be able to access the program at no cost for the duration of the two years.
